

The Comprehensive Plan Implementation Committee

1. Composition and quorum

(a) The composition of the Committee is designed to involve interested citizens, business leaders, and any other stakeholders to ensure that a variety of voices are heard and different sectors of the community are represented.

Accordingly, the Committee shall be made up of the following:

Planning and Development Director or his/her designee (non-voting)

Two (2) City Councilors - preferably one from the district being discussed (non-voting) and seven (7) representatives, all of whom shall be residents of the city (except business leaders with a business in the city).

A quorum shall consist of four (4) members.

Rational

Planning and Development Director - Overseer for Common Community Planning and Development, Economic Development and Revising Ordinances, Standards, & Regulations Responding to Land Use Actions. Updating and Implementing the Comprehensive Plan.

Two (2) City Councilors - Preferably one from the district being discussed. This councilor should be able to present current problems, concerns of residents and businesses within the district and potential opportunities within the district. This councilor should also have an intimate knowledge of current development and/or near future development in the district. The second councilor would provide for continuity should the other councilor leave the committee for any reason.

A minimum of seven (7) representatives, all whom shall be residents of the city. The Minimum seven (7) representatives provides for a set

majority of four (4) to form a quorum. This is extremely important because, as we progress through the five (5) districts we experience varying degrees of community participation. The minimum number of representatives and a set quorum allows the work to continue even with low district participation.

The exception of a non-resident business owner operating in the district allows the business community to participate and provide input from that community.
